For this assignment you will be turning in 3 pieces of work as follows.

Part 1

Once Upon a Dream



You will submit 1 photograph with the file title “Dream”. The photo will be sized to be 11x14. It is expected that you not only take the photo but apply whatever Photoshop techniques you decide are necessary to create a finished product.

The challenge is simple. You start with the theme, but the twist is that everyone needs to submit a statement with their photo that explains the ‘who, what, where, why, when or how’ they went through to get it. The photo **MUST** convey the feeling of a dream. This feeling must be presented so that the viewer “feels: the dream like quality.

Part 2

Labor

You will submit 1 photograph with the file title “Labor”. The photo will be sized to be 10x8. It is expected that you not only take the photo but apply whatever Photoshop techniques you decide are necessary to create a finished product.

This is to be a celebration of men and women working to make a better tomorrow!

Your photo must show people at work. What they are work at must be clearly conveyed in the photo You start with the theme, but the twist is that everyone needs to submit a statement with their photo that explains the ‘who, what, where, why, when or how’ they went through to get it. The photo MUST convey the feeling of a serious urban decay. This feeling must be presented so that the viewer “feels: the decay. I am not providing any hints—figure this one out for yourself. I expect some creativity.

Part 3

You will turn in a file to be sized at 16x20 titled Galaxy. This will be your finished Galaxy creation. There will be a ten point instant extra credit bonus for anyone who creates a planet with at least TWO believable rings (think of the real planet Saturn). While directions for making these rings are not included on our website, a search of the internet will yield results.

Remember, you are creating a galaxy, you are NOT to produce a finished product that looks like the samples on the class website. They are there only as a guide to show how the work is done.
